I would like to share with you our accomplishments for the 2006-07 year and highlight some major items we will be addressing in year 2007-08.

Our faculty, staff, and students continue to be recognized and rewarded for their accomplishments. One example is in the area of extramural funding. Last year our faculty secured approximately \$3.1 million in external funding. This level of scholarship allows us to remain competitive, meet clientele needs, and continue to deliver high quality educational and outreach programming and maintain exemplary research agendas.

Steve is an agricultural science instructor at Conrad-Weiser High School, Robesonia, PA.
